

NEC Final Voters List Out

The latest voter registration list has been released showing the population census of 2004 census, the number of parliamentary seats, registered voters, and percentage of registered voters, population not registered and the percentage of the voter population not registered. This new list which was collated recently shows an interesting dimension to the present voter registration and how the elections might fare for the three prominent political parties of the APC, the PMDC and the SLPP.

The region that gained the highest registered is the Western Urban Area, which is a traditional stronghold of the APC, with a resounding 491,663 voters, although 343,747 of the voters in the Western Area were not registered.

In the Provinces, the Region with the highest voter registration is the Northern Province with 846,607. Looking at the districts, the largest voter registration occurred in Kenema with 271,254, while Bonthe district registered the least at 77,659 voters.

The North and Western Area, the traditional

stronghold of the APC emerged with the highest voters registered at 1,451,982, while 1,242,693 were not registered. The Southern and Eastern region combined got 1,169,381 registered voters, with 1,114,815 not registered. There is a clear edge by the APC over the SLPP and the PMDC, looking

at its traditional strongholds of the respective parties. The PMDC on the other hand will be the spoiler which at the end of the day will be the party that will determine whether the APC or the SLPP will emerge victorious.
